What hazard have you identified? What are the risks from it?	Who is at risk?	How are the risks already controlled? What extra controls are needed?	What has changed that needs to be thought about and controlled?
A hazard is something that may cause harm or damage. The risk is the harm that may occur from the hazard.	For example: young people, adult volunteers, visitors	Controls are ways of making the activity safer by removing or reducing the risk. For example, you may use a different piece of equipment or you might change the way you do the activity.	Keep checking throughout the activity in case you need to change what you're doing or even stop the activity.
Weather	Everyone	Do not use in heavy rain or storms.	Monitor the weather conditions.
Unauthorised use	Everyone	The area is fenced with a 6 foot high wooden fence, with a lockable gate, and safety warning signs. Keys to be secured in a locked key box in office.	Ensure Gate Locked at end of session
Trampolines tip over	Participants/Leaders	Ground anchors in place to stop trampoline tipping. Routine maintenance checks by site staff	Inspection by site staff prior to use, Report issues to Manager
Getting entangled	Participants	Encouraged to tie back long hair, remove neckerchiefs, glasses and jewellery	Supervising Leaders to ensure rules followed
Falling of side of trampoline	Everyone	Safety nets surround the trampoline. Routine maintenance checks by site staff	Inspection by site staff prior to use, Report issues to Manager
Getting squashed by a larger person	Participants	Rules in place stating only one person at a time may use a trampoline at any one time.	Provide safety briefing to leaders and highlight operating procedure.
Slipping on the Trampoline	Participants	No shoes to be worn on the trampoline. Surface to be cleaned and swept before use.	Provide safety briefing to leaders and highlight operating procedure.
Falling on neck	Participants	Safety Guidelines given prior to start of activity restricting usage.	Provide safety briefing to leaders and highlight operating procedure.
